## Conditions for provision of water supply

Date:

What size service / meter do you require

- I. Water supply is only available for domestic purposes and / or the water of livestock.
- 2. A standard service consists of a 20mm meter. Charges for the provision of standard service are published in Council's Revenue Policy. Non standard connections are quoted on application. No payment will be accepted for any connection without a member of Council's Cowra Operations Department providing a quote.
- 3. The meter remains the property of Council.
- 4. Council does not accept responsibility for the loss of water, or resultant cost, on the landowner's side of the meter.
- 5. Council will meet any costs associated with the maintenance and repair of the meter / service due to normal wear and tear. Council may impose a charge for repairing damage not caused by normal wear and tear to the meter and / or service. The owner of the property will be responsible for this charge.
- 6. Connections in urban areas will be made from the nearest main to the boundary of the property. Connection from the meter to the dwelling is the responsibility of the owner.
- 7. All installations from the meter are to be carried out by a suitably and licensed person. The requirements of the Local Government Act, the Water Supply Code and appropriate trade standards must be met.

## Additional conditions for rural connections

- 8. Connections on land zoned rural or rural residential will be made adjacent to the water main.
- 9. On site storage with a minimum capacity of 25 kilolitres must be provided by the property owner. No immediate connections are allowed. The water level in the storage is to be controlled by a ball valve. A minimum air gap of 100mm must be maintained between the inlet and the overflow of the storage.
- 10. The service may be governed by a flow control, normally set to a limit of 13 litres per minute.
- 11. A pressure reducing valve (PRV) may need to be fitted to the service. The purchase and maintenance of the PRV is the responsibility of the property owner.
- 12. Where the private installation is required to cross over any privately owned land, a copy of that owner's written permission must be submitted for Council's record.
- 13. Where the private installation is required to be placed in, or across, a road or rail reserve the Authority responsible is to be consulted and any conditions complied with. Council is to be provided with an Authority's written permission.
